*Join fellow educators on Friday, March 13, 2009 at the NJ Law Center for a fascinating and rewarding day exploring law-related (LRE) issues.*

The full-day conference gets off to a lively start with a performance by the George Street Playhouse Touring Theatre of a riveting play that confronts the increasing problem of cyber-bullying. *IRL: In Real Life* depicts how online intimidation can affect every facet of students' lives, consequences for both victim and victimizer, and how to take a proactive role in ending cyber-bullying. The play is made possible by a grant from the New Jersey State Bar Foundation.

Following the performance, you will attend two workshops of your choosing on relevant, law-related matters. Topics may cover such hot-button legal issues as genocide, gangs, special education law for mainstream teachers and other school staff, as well as looking at history through Lincoln-era court cases, court structure and purpose. The presenters will identify creative ways to integrate those and other aspects of law-related education into the existing curriculum.

A complimentary continental breakfast and sandwich luncheon will be served.

The full-day conference is free of charge. However, a **refundable \$20 security deposit check**, made payable to the New Jersey State Bar Foundation, must accompany each registration. Please enclose a separate check for each participant. We do not accept cash or purchase orders. Deposit checks will be returned to those who attend the conference and to anyone who gives 72 hours' notice of inability to attend. **Checks from registrants who do not attend, or who do**

**not give adequate notice of their inability to attend, will be used to defray conference expenses due to no-show registrants, and therefore will be forfeited.**

Registration will be accepted **by mail only** on a first-come, first-served basis. Confirmation letters with workshop selection forms will be sent after we receive your registration form and check. If all spaces are filled, you will be notified by mail that you are on our waiting list.

**Directions to the New Jersey Law Center**

*From New Jersey Turnpike:* Exit 9 to Rt. 18 North to Rt. 1 South to Ryders Lane, New Brunswick. The New Jersey Law Center is the first right turn off Ryders Lane.

*From Princeton:* Take Rt. 1 North to the second Ryders Lane exit (Ryders Lane/New Brunswick). Ryders Lane passes over Rt. 1. Law Center is the first right turn.

*From Garden State Parkway (Newark):* Take Garden State Parkway to Exit 130, Rt. 1 South. Continue on Rt. 1 South for approximately 8 miles to Ryders Lane/New Brunswick. Follow directions from Turnpike above.

*From Garden State Parkway (Shore Points):* Take the Garden State Parkway North to Exit 127, to Rt. 440/287 North, to Rt. 1 South. Follow directions from Garden State Parkway (Newark) above.
